3. Next Step: Sending the Draft of the Law Authorizing the Creation of a Stormwater Management District to the County

No comments were received on the local law titled, “ A Local Law Authorizing the County to Establish Watershed and Stormwater Management Districts and to Work in Partnership with Westchester Municipalities to Protect Property from Floods.” This draft was mailed to each of the LISWIC member municipalities in March.

Al Gatta presented a local law, introduced to the County Board of Legislators by Legislator Thomas Abinanti, which would authorize the establishment of a flood control program. LISWIC selected members of a subcommittee to review the County’s proposed law and report recommendations to the rest of the LISWIC representatives. This subcommittee includes Al Gatta, Chuck Strome and Anne McAndrews.

Nancy Seligson, Councilwoman from the Town of Mamaroneck discussed the NYSDEC Phase II Stormwater management program and asked the LISWIC representatives for suggestions for improving the program.
