4. Regional Stormwater Management District

Westchester County passed the law creating stormwater management districts for each watershed. There is no funding budgeted for projects at this time. LISWIC members must have their chief elected official designate a representative to serve on the district watershed advisory board. It was suggested that a consultant be hired to create a capital improvement

plan for the Lower Long Island Sound Watershed that would identify all the capital improvement projects that would benefit the district. This would be accomplished by interviewing each municipality. A subcommittee, to include Chuck Strome, Al Gatta, Stephen Altieri and Chris Bradbury, will schedule a meeting with the County Planning Department to find out what our district will need to provide in order to obtain funding. Copies of each municipality's stormwater law and stormwater management plan should be sent to Elizabeth Paul. Contact should be made with Mount Vernon and other municipalities that have not been attending the LISWIC meetings.
