2. Approval of Minutes – June 29, 2012

The Minutes of the June 29, 2012 meeting were approved as submitted.

3. Guest Speakers: Thomas Lauro, Commissioner Westchester County DEF and Shay Gavin, Savin Engineers – Update on the LIS Flow Monitoring Program

Commissioner Lauro and Shay Gavin of Savin Engineers presented the results of the flow monitoring study. The study identified locations that were found to have excessive infiltration and inflow (I/I) into the sewer system. Data was collected using flow meters and rain gauges that were installed throughout the storm sewer system. Flows were considered excessive if they exceeded 150 gallons per capita per day (gpcd) over a 24-hour period. A table was presented that summarized the number of days each municipality exceeded this flow level.

Savin engineers presented a schedule for the implementation of a flow reduction strategy, followed by a question and answer period. A copy of the power point presentation will be emailed to the LISWIC Coordinator.

Guests left the meeting and a discussion of the County Flow Monitoring Study continued among LISWIC members. It was decided that LISWIC should be involved with any discussions pertaining to the scheduling and implementation of the flow reduction plan. Chris Bradbury will prepare a letter to request this.

4. Phase I Reconnaissance Plan for the Lower Long Island Sound Drainage Basin

A letter was sent to each municipality requesting additional information for the completion of Phase I of the Reconnaissance Plan. It is important that any necessary information is received by the County and Malcolm Pirnie/Arcadis.

Phase II may be completed by the Westchester County Planning Department, eliminating the need for LISWIC to raise additional funds at this time.
