2. Approval of Minutes – July 27, 2012

The Minutes of the July 27, 2012 meeting were approved as submitted.

3. Treasurer's Report

Lorraine Walsh reported that there is 5343.41 remaining in the LISWIC account. There is no need to collect dues at this point.

4. Stormwater Reconnaissance Plan for the Coastal Long Island Sound Watershed

The County has released the Reconnaissance Plan for the Long Island Sound Watershed. The document summarizes all of the data collected from each municipality including a list of flood control projects that have been identified. Of the 150 projects listed, 23 have been identified as high priority.

LISWIC will be the local advisory group that makes recommendations to the County and could rank projects in order of priority so that we are not all competing for the same pot of

money at the same time. It was suggested that LISWIC ask the County for funds to rank projects and complete additional studies. We are all interested in receiving some of the 20 million available to fund projects. It is difficult to prioritize projects because our residents perceive any project as a priority if they are impacted by flooding.

Moving forward, should LISWIC serve a role in identifying which projects apply for funding first, or should each municipality seek funding independently? It was decided that each municipality will submit independent requests to the County for funding. Chuck Strome agreed to send a letter to the County.
